

Whilst it is lovely to see so many pupils scooting and cycling to and from school can we remind you to think about others, especially on Beresford Bridge and when coming through the gates.



On the school site scooters & bikes should be pushed and not ridden!

Could we also remind parents that private escooters are effectively illegal to ride on public roads and paths.

If you were caught on a public highway, you'd technically be driving a motor vehicle with no insurance - you could be liable for a fixed penalty of £300 and six points on your driving licence. If the case went to court, you could get an unlimited fine and be disqualified from driving. Your scooter could also be impounded by the police.

Also, please be polite and respectful to every member of our community when coming into school. Allowing a little space through the gates, walking on the left on the paths makes the travel to and from school much easier for everyone.
